New House Is Nearing Completion

Sat. November 5th 12:30 a.m.

We are ending our soft sell, word of mouth, arm twisting fund raising. We are now beginning the general alumni solicitation. This is a once in a lifetime request for funds. We would like to use your name and donation level when soliciting other unsuspecting Brothers. We have pledges for \$1,500,054. We need more.

At first glance, one could say that this may not be the most worthy cause. This is correct! It is not, but it is fun to do and worthwhile. Here is why: The city of University Park will not allow our University to build any new buildings without incremental parking spaces. The best location for these incremental parking spaces is where the Lambda Chi House, SAE House, and Letterman Hall now stand.

In a way, SAE and Lambda Chi hold the "Keys to the Kingdom" and have agreed to help SMU by relocating on Dyer Street, down from the old ATO House and behind both the Kappa Sigma and KA Houses. In return, SAE is now able to build a new house that will hold 46 men, have 12 single rooms, and 17 doubles, all with private bathrooms, a library, and media center. Construction is almost complete.

Descriptions of the new buildings are as follows:

- The Dedman Center for Lifetime Sports, next to Moody Coliseum, (Phase I opening Fall 2005 is 115,000 square feet, which includes basketball/volleyball courts, indoor pool, spinning rooms, weight fitness, and a 40-foot rock climbing wall. Phase II, opening Fall 2006, is 50,000 square feet and includes 6 racquetball courts, indoor soccer/hockey, 6 badminton courts, 2 basketball courts, and aerobic/dance rooms).
- The James M Collins Center for Executive Education is an extension of the Cox School of Business (3 stories, 6,700 square feet, across from the SAE House).

This is a win/win situation and means that your donation helps SMU to expand and SAE to build a new house. We are asking you for a donation in what we call "spread the pain" to join an illustrious group of friends and brothers who are paying for their past sins. MOVE IN DATE IS OCTOBER 31ST!

Over forty brothers will move into the new SAE house on October 28, 2005. This \$3.7 million fully furnished facility will have 29 rooms, 12 singles and 17 doubles for a maximum occupancy of 46 men. Each room will feature a private bathroom with shower, individual control thermostat, and fully equipped furniture. This 20,000 square foot facility will have a complete media room, library, two pool tables, card playing table and dining service for 75 men. The state of the art kitchen will feature Chef Scott Allison, our chief chef for 21 years and will be equipped with a pizza oven, as well as a commercial grill for cooking steaks. The backyard will have a fully lighted NBA half court basketball court as well as an Alumni Pavilion. The back of the yard will feature a retaining wall, an eight foot fence with a hedge row of 14 foot Nellie R. Stevens holly hedges.

Dr. Gerald Turner, President of SMU, will dedicate the new SAE house on Saturday, November 5^{th} at 12:30 A.M.

SAE HIRES CLEANING SERVICE

The spring 2005 officers interviewed five candidates for House Director and selected Steve Schutze, a fifth year law student at SMU. We are pleased to have Steve as our House Director. He will perform the same functions as a Resident Hall Director. He has been accepted by our members and has been successful in integrating both the rules of the SAE National, SMU and our Alumni organization. Steve grew up in Dallas, and graduated from SMU in 2001. He was a member of Sigma Chi and held the position of President. He graduated from SMU Law school in May 2005 and is currently taking a fifth year specialization in Laws in Taxation. Steve will attend the Chapter meetings and is a welcomed friend, policeman at times, enforcer, advisor and keeps the men out of trouble when necessary. This is the ideal situation for SAE and hopefully will be a model program for other fraternal groups.

SAE AND SMU COOPERATION ON A PERPETUAL REVENUE AGREEMENT



Even though SMU will own and operate our new House, all revenues from rent will be segregated into a special SAE account. Therefore, all net cash flow from operations will remain for the benefit of SAE. We project a positive cash flow from rentals, after expenses of \$18,000 to \$25,000 per year, after debt retirement.

THE MERIT KEY AWARDED

The Merit Key is one of the Fraternity's highest honors, awarded to an alumnus who is especially active in serving SAE. The award is presented for individual's sustained leadership to the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity. The Merit Key was first presented at the 91st National Convention Friday, August 22, 1947, on Mackinac Island, Michigan. At the end of 2004, only 451 have been awarded, of which 254 recipients are still alive. Considering there are over 254,000 initiates at the end of 2004, the Merit Key has been awarded to only 0.17 percent of all Brothers. Eminent Supreme Archon Cobb C. Torrance (Georgia '21) wrote to Key holders circa 1946, stating, "Men like you, who joined the Fraternity for life and not just your college days, are mostly responsible for the leadership and prestige Sigma Alpha Epsilon enjoys today." The fact remains true today. To be awarded the Merit Key, an alumnus must have been recommended by the Province Archon of the state in which the candidate resides. The recommendation is then forwarded to the Eminent Supreme Recorder in Evanston. The recommendation must be approved by a two-thirds vote of the Supreme Council. The award (a gold key and a certificate) may be presented at any special gathering of the Fraternity, including national and provincial conventions, as well as Founder's Day celebrations.

2005 Hall of Fame Inductees of the

Texas Delta Chapter of Sigma Alpha Epsilon

Harry Shuford '36



Harry Shuford '36 has retired from his law practice at Shuford, Jackson and Allen and currently sits as a trustee for The Hillcrest Foundation, which was established by the W.W. Caruth Jr. family. At SMU, brother Shuford served as a member of the board of trustees (1962-76), was awarded the Distinguished Alumni Award in 1963, and the Alumnus of the Year Award from the School of Law in 1960. During the late 1970s, he was the Special Gifts chairman for the Design for the Third Generation Capital Campaign. While at SMU, Mr. Shuford was president of both his Freshman Class, 1932, and Senior Class, 1935. He was a member of the SMU Varsity Football Team, 1933-35, including the team that won the National Championship in 1936. Mr. Shuford was also a member of Sigma Alpha Epsilon, Punjaub, Cycen Fjodr, and Alpha Kappa Psi, as well as president of Blue Key Men's Honorary Society, 1935-36. In addition, brother Shuford is a life member of the SMU Alumni Association, where he served as president, 1948-49. He has also served as the reunion chair for his Class of 1936 and as an Access counselor for the Career

Center.Brother Shuford was previously married to Virginia L. Shuford '37 who past away in 1975. He has two children by this marriage, both of whom are SMU alumni: Harry Lindsley Shuford '63 and David William Shuford '67. David Shuford is married to Karen Shuford '70, who was a recipient of the 2000 SMU Distinguished Alumni Award. Harry Shuford's second wife, Claire Blakeney Shuford, whom he married in 1976, past away in 2000.

William Kyle Rote Sr '51 (Deceased)



A charter member of SMU's Doak Walker Associates in 2002, brother William Kyle Rote Sr
'51 lived in the Baltimore area. He was an All-American football player at SMU, where his performance against Notre Dame in 1949 was voted the single greatest effort by a Texas athlete in the first half of the century. Brother Rote, who played two years in the same backfield with Doak Walker, was named All-American in 1950 and finished second in the Heisman Trophy Award voting. He was the #1 overall pick in the National Football League draft in 1951 by the New York Giants. Mr. Rote spent 11 seasons with the Giants, starting as a running back and moving to wide receiver due to the presence of Frank Gifford. He scored 52 touchdowns and grabbed 301 passes for 4,909 yards, which were the Giants all-time records at the time of his retirement. Brother Rote won an NFL Championship with the New York Giants in 1956. He was elected to four Pro Bowls as a receiver. Upon his retirement, Rote was named to the Texas Hall of Fame in 1962. He is also a member of the Southwest Conference Hall of Fame

(1964), and the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame (1995). Brother Rote was a football and basketball star at Jefferson High School in San Antonio, TX prior to attending SMU. While still a player in the National Football League, he was one of the founders of the Professional Football Players' Union and served as its first president. Upon his retirement from football, Mr. Rote entered broadcasting. He began as a radio announcer in New York with the Giants locker-room show and also served as an announcer for NBC for the American Football League games until 1974. William Kyle Rote Sr. passed away in August of 2002.
