# New SAE House is Dedicated – November 5th, 2005

**\$1.5 Million raised, Occupies 46 brothers; Last chance to donate** 



SMU SAE is the finest fraternity houses ever built at a private university

The new SAE house was dedicated before an excited crowd on November 5th 2005, during Homecoming weekend. The following weekend, undergraduate members were able to move in and officially occupy the new house, creating a special atmosphere for both actives and alumni alike.

#### **Get Your Name On The SAE Cornerstone** (EVERY DONOR WILL BE RECOGNIZED)

The long-term legacy of the Texas Delta Chapter is not yet secured. As of print, our Chapter has seen over 150 alumni, parents, and friends contribute \$1,557,725 towards the project, surpassing the initial goal of \$1.5 million needed to fund the house construction. We are now on the last leg of the campaign, with only \$500 thousand remaining before we reach our final goal of \$2 million. We will continue to solicit funds until August of this year, at which time all donors will be recognized with permanent plaques placed next to each room or area of the house, and the names of every donor etched in marble on the "Wall Of Donors" in the entry hallway.
