Construction begins on the new SAE house

Sigma Alpha Epsilon and SMU have joined forces to build a new chapter House. SMU has offered to fund a majority of the new, SMUowned and managed facility, with \$2,000,000 plus project oversight services; SAE alumni have agreed to contribute \$1,500,000 to cover the remaining construction costs. Gifts are made to SMU and are tax deductible. The future of SAE at SMU will be closely linked to the new fraternity house. Our architectural plans are complete, bids have been received, the site has been cleared, and we have broken ground. SAE has agreed to vacate the old house next fall so that SMU can start construction of the parking garage for both the Cox School of Business and the new Collins Center for Graduate Studies. SAE has already obtained donations of \$899,000. This is a good start, but we need your financial assistance. Therefore, this is an SAE fund-raising pitch that only comes around once every 75 years and is a one-time capital request.

As we look back on the great fraternity experience that we all had as well as many others, this new House will give SAE and SMU a chance to ensure that same opportunity for future SAE's. We need to raise \$1.5

million. To achieve this goal we need additional leadership gifts.

I am convinced that this SAE fund raising drive is of critical importance to the future of the Greek system at SMU. If we are successful in this drive, it will set a positive tone for the Greek system for the next decade. Dr. Gerald Turner and the administration believe the SAE's have a strength that runs deep among the alums. They are correct! This is the one time we can show that strength.

We have begun. Our architect, Dale Selzer, has designed and remodeled many fraternities including the SMU FIJI House and SAE House (in 1972). He also designed Mockingbird Station. He has experience, knowledge, and is forward thinking. We have also incorporated suggestions from our members currently living in the House. We will have 19,983 square feet versus the current 16,123 square feet. It will house 40/46 men versus the current capacity of 33 men. All rooms will have bathrooms.

We believe, based on our SAE undergraduate focus group research, that we have created a fraternity house that will favorably compete with off-campus apartments and also the next generation of SMU Residence Halls. These will probably be built on the land formerly occupied by Mrs.

This marks our ninth-straight semester with an in-House GPA above 3.0.


HOUSENEWS
